We are proud to present you The Woodson YMCA's 2022 Annual Report. 2022 was a year of amazing growth for our organization. We fully recovered from the pandemic and have now reached new all-time highs in membership. In the process, we've made an impact on thousands of lives in our community.

Our membership growth was led by our 55+ Members who make up 48% of our membership base. The Landing has played a major role in our 55+ population growth at the Y. It has provided a special place for Members to connect and live their best life. If you have not visited The Landing to see the special place it is, we encourage you to do so.

Our Child Care Centers continue to serve families and are very full with large waiting lists. We are actively working on trying to expand our reach outside of our walls to help meet this glaring need in our community for additional child care. This is our top priority in 2023!

At a time in our country when there is a major lifeguard shortage, we have defied this trend and been able to recruit, train, hire and effectively run numerous pools in our community. During 2022, we not only operated the four pools located in our YMCA Branches but also the Mosinee Aquatic Center, the Weston Aquatic Center and the Rothschild/Schofield Aquatic Center. This helped our communities to safely enjoy local aquatic facilities and their area pools are safer when YMCA Lifeguards are on duty.

With our increase in membership we have seen tremendous growth in swimming, gymnastics, competitive teams, youth sports, camp and many other youth and family programs. We have never served more youth in our organization than this past year.

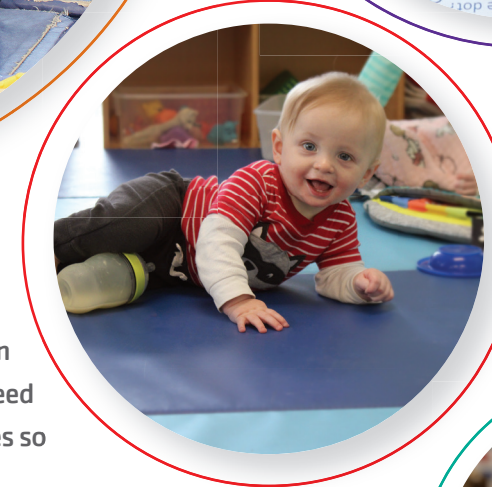
In 2022, we started building a new storm shelter, and we finished building a pavilion that provides a shaded area for the kids to enjoy their lunch at camp.

### Swim Lessons

As "America's Swim Instructor," the YMCA teaches children of all ages and from all backgrounds how to stay safe in and around water, so that water can be a fun experience and not a fearful one. The Woodson YMCA taught 2,005 kids life-saving and drowning prevention skills in 2022!

### Summer School Swim Lessons

We partnered with the Wausau and Mosinee School Districts to provide swim lessons for their out-of-school learning program in the summer of 2022. Children from Kindergarten to 5th Grade had 5 weeks of swim lessons, with a total of 442 children participating. Water safety skills not only save lives, but also ensure that all children can safely enjoy the health and recreational benefits of swimming and other water-based activities.

Woodson YMCA Lifeguards are serving our Y Members and our Greater Wausau Community!

We now manage both Weston and Rothschild/Schofield Aquatic Centers providing consistency with training and rule enforcement throughout our community which increases water safety for all.

We increased community programming in Mosinee by hiring a full time Director to focus on Aquatics and Community Programming specifically aimed at increasing opportunities for Seniors in Mosinee.

### CPR Certification Classes

### Wellness Centers & Fitness Classes

Our Wellness Centers and Fitness Classes are busy with Members exercising and growing strong physically and mentally.

We have hired 2 full time trainers, invested in technology to help our Members get the best results, and focused on continuing education for our staff to grow as fitness professionals.

We are adding new programs and activities regularly and are excited about the future of wellness in our community!

### Pickleball

Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in America and our Y has an ever growing pickleball community. The Y offers learn-to-play classes and has dedicated court time at both branches. We host an Annual Pickleball Tournament with 124 participants in 2022.

Pickleball provides a great aerobic workout while improving balance and strength. It also creates an excellent opportunity to build social connections, stay active and have fun!

At the heart of the Y lies the power to transform—both yourself and the world around you. From our wide range of fitness, personal training, sports and aquatics programs, to our group social activities, we offer an array of options focused on strengthening spirit, mind and body.



### Youth Karate

Karate provided more than 70 kids the opportunity to start their journey towards a black belt in 2022.

Passion has been driving this program from the beginning. As each child starts with a white belt their enthusiasm to learn and improve grows with every new belt they earn.

Through Karate, kids were able to build better confidence, become physically and mentally stronger, and learn the value of respect. Youth Karate flourished in 2022 with multiple classes, skill levels, and several participants beginning to compete in Karate Tournaments.



### Creative Cooking

Our Parent Child Cooking classes have been a huge hit with our families at the Y.

Classes are a hands on culinary experience for the parents and children as young as age 3. Menus and recipes help guide the preparation, from No Bake Cheese Cake to layering Lasagna. Kids learn kitchen safety, are exposed to new food and get to take all of their creations home at the end of class.

Our Cooking Classes collaborate with a volunteer from Fit Families Health First, bringing knowledge of nutrition and healthy practices for all.

We love to see their little faces light up as each child discovers they can cook!!



### Gymnastics

In 2022 we've experienced 50% growth in participation in our Gymnastics Program.

There are now over 300 youth attending our classes each session, over 24 gymnasts in our newly launched pre-team program, and our Whirlers competitive team is 56 gymnasts strong!

Our Gymnastics Team continues to earn top team trophies at every meet, showing that our coaches and instructors are among the best in the state.

This past year has grown in hustle, bustle and buzz! Whether it be our littlest tots enjoying classes again, the packed hallway viewing the gymnasts, or camps and movie nights the team has celebrated, our gymnastics program has brought a lot of growth this year.

We continue to build on blossoming skills and techniques while fostering friendships throughout the year, and we look forward to what is ahead.
